The Richard E. Surface Recognition Award	To recognize contributions to and sustained support of OSHP from someone not necessarily a pharmacist. This award was created in 1989 as the OSHP Recognition Award and it was renamed after its first recipient, Richard Surface, in 1999.	As determined by the OSHP Board of Directors to recognize sustained service to the organization.	May be submitted along with supporting material(s) by any OSHP member, OSHP Board of Directors, or Local Affiliated Chapters of OSHP. Nomination proposals should be submitted to the OSHP Board of Directors. The OSHP Timothy D. Moore Pharmacy Management Award	To recognize a health-system pharmacist who has demonstrated exemplary leadership and managerial performance in the delivery of health-system pharmacy services in a health-system organization.	The focus of this award is based upon recent (preferably within the past year) managerial expertise and leadership which resulted in significant improvement or expansion of pharmacy services and concomitant management of available resources.	May be submitted along with supporting material(s) by any OSHP member, OSHP Board of Directors, or Local Affiliated Chapters of OSHP. 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The OSHP Resident Award	To recognize a pharmacy resident who has demonstrated exceptional skills in the area of pharmacy residency practice.	The nominee must currently be a pharmacy resident or have completed a pharmacy residency program within the past year. If appropriate, both a PGY-1 and PGY-2 resident award will be presented at the discretion of the Professional Affairs Division and voted upon by the OSHP Board of Directors.	May be submitted along with supporting material(s) by any OSHP member, OSHP Board of Directors, or Local Affiliated Chapters of OSHP. A letter of recommendation from the pharmacy residency director or a program preceptor must accompany the nomination (maximum 3 letters). The OSHP Student Pharmacist Award	To recognize an outstanding student pharmacist who plans to pursue a career in health-system pharmacy practice.	The intern should be a student pharmacist graduating within the next year and in good standing with an accredited college of pharmacy who plans to pursue a career in health-system pharmacy. The OSHP Scholarship for Non-Graduating PharmD Students	A merit-based scholarship designed to recognize an outstanding professional student enrolled in a Doctor of Pharmacy program at an Ohio-based College of Pharmacy.	Students in the final year of their program are ineligible for consideration. The scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic achievements, leadership abilities, professional activities, references, and interest in pharmacy. The recipient is expected to be an active participant in one of the OSHP Divisions and should make every effort to attend the semi-annual OSHP Division Days.	Scholarship applications highlighting activities, service, leadership, recognition, work experience, and two letters of recommendation may be submitted electronically. Maximum 2 letters of recommendation. 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The OSHP Residency Program Director Award	To recognize a pharmacist who has demonstrated excellence in the position of Residency Program Director.	The nominee must be a pharmacist practicing in the state of Ohio who is currently or has previously served (within the past year) as a Residency Program Director in the state of Ohio. The ideal nominee should demonstrate: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dedication to teaching and learning the practice of Pharmacy • Exemplary preceptorship ability • Professionalism • Having established/expanded residency program positions • Promotes and advocates for residency program training in the state of Ohio 	May be submitted along with supporting material(s) by any OSHP member, OSHP Board of Directors, or Local Affiliated Chapters of OSHP. The nominee’s affiliation and involvement with residency training should be well described in a letter of recommendation. Additionally, characteristics and a history of the residency program the individual is involved with should be provided. A CV is highly recommended for submission as well. The OSHP Preceptor of the Year Award	To recognize a pharmacist who has demonstrated excellence in precepting pharmacy students and/or pharmacy residents. The recipient of this award will have demonstrated significant and continued dedication to the education of pharmacy students and/or pharmacy residents above and beyond the general expectations of a pharmacy preceptor.	The nominee must be a pharmacist practicing in the state of Ohio who is currently or has previously served (within the past year) as a preceptor to pharmacy students and/or residents in the state of Ohio. The ideal nominee should have served as a preceptor for a minimum of one year and should demonstrate: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exemplary preceptorship ability • Professionalism • Promotion of innovative scholarly and/or practice activities • Advocacy for pharmacy student and/or resident training in the state of Ohio 	May be submitted by any OSHP member, OSHP Board of Directors, or Local Affiliated Chapters of OSHP. 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The OSHP Emerging Leader Award	To recognize a pharmacist within the first 5 years after graduation who has demonstrated exemplary pharmacy practice leadership and engagement with OSHP or other professional organizations.	The nominee must be a pharmacist practicing in the state of Ohio within five years after graduation with his or her first pharmacy degree. Current pharmacy residents are not eligible for this award; any nominations for residents should be submitted through the OSHP Resident Award. Any pharmacist who is a member of OSHP is eligible, and this award is not limited to those serving in formal leadership positions in their practice. 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The OSHP Best Practice Advancement Success Award	To recognize innovative Ohio health-systems who have demonstrated pharmacy practice advancements in accordance with the American Society of Health-Systems Pharmacy (ASHP) Practice Advancement Initiative (PAI).	May be submitted along with supporting material(s) by any OSHP member, OSHP Board of Directors, or Local Affiliated Chapters of OSHP. Self-nominations are acceptable for this award. Criteria					
<p>Nominations must represent pharmacy departments located within the state of Ohio. Any Ohio institution is eligible, and this award is not limited to just pharmacy health-systems. Departments should establish an innovative best practice that has demonstrated clear benefits in patient care and the advancement of pharmacy practice. Emphasis should be placed on incorporating at least one of ASHP’s PAI objectives into institutional practice. Ideally, nominated departments should demonstrate characteristics such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Utilizing pharmacists to improve medication use and optimize medication related outcomes Expansion of technician roles to prepare and distribute medications Promotion of appropriate training and credentialing for pharmacists and technicians aimed at activities performed within the scope of practice Pharmacy departments utilization of available automation and technology to improve patient safety and workflow efficacy Innovation within pharmacy practice <p>Award winning programs will be asked to create a presentation (e.g. video, PowerPoint) showcasing their best practice initiatives. A focus should be placed on implementation and initiation of various phases of the project.</p> <p>To be eligible for the award, nominations should include information regarding the institution’s background, practice setting, and current pharmacy practice model. Additionally, institutions should highlight their innovative practice initiatives including outcomes and future directions. Finally, strategies for potential sustainment should be incorporated into the nomination.</p>
